First of all our new President & CEO, Heidi Daniel, will arrive. Heidi has been the CEO of the Youngstown, Ohio Library, the same library system where Joseph Wheeler served as Director before

coming to the Pratt in 1926. Wheeler opened the new Central Library in 1933. After the historic renovations are completed, Heidi will reopen the Central Library in 2019.

Heidi Daniel is an innovative and passionate leader, and the Boards are dedicated to providing her with all the support we can muster as she takes charge of our beloved Pratt Library. She and I have the good fortune to succeed visionary leaders – Dr. Carla Hayden and Pat Lasher – who have set a very high bar for us.

Pratt Welcomes New President & CEO



The Enoch Pratt Free Library is proud to name Heidi Daniel as the new President and Chief Executive Officer of the Pratt Library. An experienced leader, Daniel has served as Executive Director of The Public Library of Youngstown and Mahoning County in Ohio since 2012.

"Heidi Daniel has the experience and vision to meet the challenges and opportunities of an urban library system. Her energy and charisma will help guide the Pratt in the ever-changing library world," says Ben Rosenberg, Chair of the Pratt Boards of Trustees and Directors. "My passion for public libraries led me to seek the job at the Pratt," says Daniel. "It is one of the crown jewels of public libraries in the country, and I believe it is an integral part in the future success of Baltimore."

Daniel currently oversees 15 branch libraries in the Youngstown area. She has led the system through the construction of two new buildings, completed the re-model of a library, and recently began supervising the building of another new branch. She's started innovative new services, including a Pop-Up Library and the circulation of mobile Wi-Fi hotspots. "The library of today is not the library in ten years. It's probably not even the library in five years," says Daniel. "For me, that's exciting because it gives us a great opportunity to reach more people in more meaningful ways with great impact."

In 2015, Daniel was named Ohio Librarian of the Year. Prior to Youngstown, she worked at both the Houston Public Library and the Metropolitan Library System of Oklahoma City. She began her career in children's and teen services. Daniel says, "The public library is a convener of all people. It's a place you can come and connect with other people, with information, and with entertainment. The Enoch Pratt Free Library is a vital resource in Baltimore and has a bright future ahead of it."

Gordon Krabbe, Interim Pratt CEO says, "I am thrilled the Board has selected a new CEO with Ms. Daniel's credentials and experience. She is joining the library at a time of exciting growth and expansion, and I look forward to working with her to fulfill those opportunities." Rosenberg adds, "I want to thank the Search Committee, led by Sayra Meyerhoff, for their hard work."

Daniel says, "As my career has progressed, I've really held onto the feeling of libraries as a transformer for people's lives." She will start at the Pratt Library later this summer.

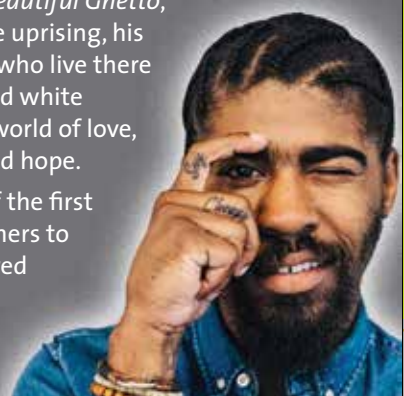

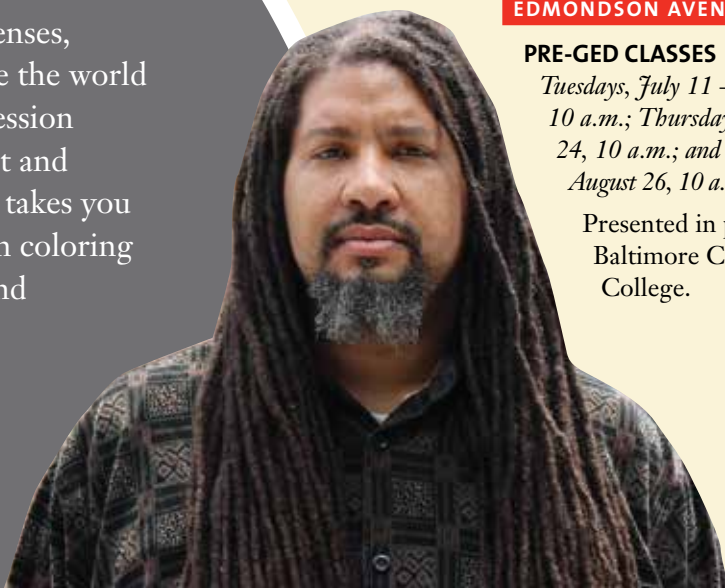
