

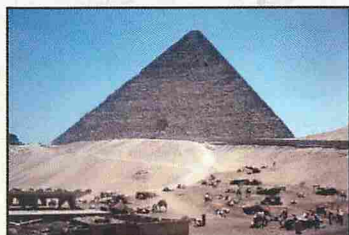

Photographer Denny Lynch takes you on an exciting tour of Egypt, beginning in



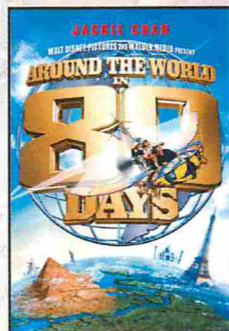
Alexandria and ending in Aswan. He will share some of his favorite images of temples, statues and tombs located along the Nile River Valley.

LITERATURE OF THE WORLD

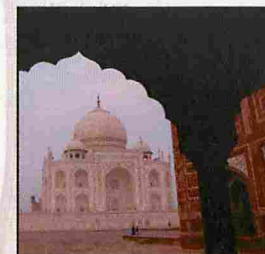
