Biographical/Historical

Dr. Hiltgunt Margaret Zassenhaus, MD (1916-2004) was a German born philologist and doctor best known for her work aiding Scandinavian political prisoners in Germany during WWII (1939-1945).

Hiltgunt Margret Zassenhaus was born on July 10, 1916 in Hamburg to Julius and Margaret Zassenhaus, and Hiltgunt was the youngest of four children: Hans (mathematician), Willfried (doctor), Günther (doctor), and Hiltgunt (philologist/doctor). The Zassenhaus family witnessed the rise of the Nazis party to power during the 1930s, and in this time, the Nazi party removed Julius from his position as headmaster due to political differences. Despite the challenges, the family's resistance to the Nazis began early. Hiltgunt's mother Margaret began assisting Jews in Hamburg by helping them hide or leave Germany. Zassenhaus held a degree in Scandinavian languages from Hamburg University, which gained her employment as a translator/interpreter with the German Justice Department. To help the family financially, she accepted a position with the Justice Department as a censor for the mail sent from various ghettos to Scandinavia. Rather than redacting and censoring the letters, Zassenhaus passed along the unedited letters and included more specific requests for help. Zassenhaus was eventually dismissed from the position when mail services from the ghettos stopped. After the invasion of Denmark and Norway, the Justice Department called back Hiltgunt to serve as an interpreter for the Scandinavian political prisoners.

As an interpreter, Zassenhaus smuggled in goods such as food, medicine, letters, and news for the prisoners. She was aided by the pastors and chaplains from the Norwegian and Danish churches in Germany, who were allowed to visit prisoners. For her efforts, the prisoners referred to Zassenhaus as the "Angel of the Penitentiaries." Zassenhaus kept record of each prisoner on notecards, and she created her own filing system to track the prisoners' movements from one prison to another. When Swedish diplomat Folke Bernadotte negotiated for the release of the Scandinavian prisoners in 1945, the notecards Zassenhaus maintained allowed for the White Buses from Sweden and other Scandinavian Red Cross efforts to locate and retrieve nearly 1,200 prisoners who were scheduled for execution on "Day X." Towards the end of the war, the Gestapo finally discovered Zassenhaus's assistance to the prisoners, and they issued an arrest and execution order for her; however, in the breakdown and chaos of the war's end, she hid and avoided arrest. Immediately after the war, Zassenhaus helped orphans in Hamburg and worked with British Intelligence to assist with the "denazification" efforts. Zassenhaus petitioned the former prisoners in Scandinavia for assistance, and they sent aid. The former prisoners also petitioned the governments of Norway and Denmark to invite Zassenhaus to Scandinavia so that she could complete her medical studies. Zassenhaus earned a place in the medical school of the University of Copenhagen, and she was the first German allowed in Denmark after WWII. To help pay for her studies, Zassenhaus was given a book deal, and she wrote *Halt Wacht im Dunkel* (*On Guard in the Dark*) (1948) about her time as an interpreter during the WWII. After completing medical school, Zassenhaus secured a visa to the United States with her mother Margaret, and they both arrived in Baltimore in May 1952. Zassenhaus completed medical residency in Baltimore City Hospital, and in the 1960s, she opened her own private practice in Towson, MD.

In 1974, Zassenhaus published *Walls: Resisting the Third Reich - One Woman's Story*, and the Norwegian government and veterans nominated Zassenhaus for the Nobel Peace Prize in the same year. After the success of *Walls*, Zassenhaus maintained a public speaking career through the 1990s while also maintaining her private medical practice. Zassenhaus received numerous top honors, including multiple Scandinavian Red Crosses, the Royal Order of Saint Olav's, the Royal Order of the Dannebrog, and Order of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany. Along with national honors, Zassenhaus received numerous honors, awards, and honorary degrees in the United States. Dr. Hiltgunt Margret Zassenhaus died on November 20, 2004 in Baltimore, Maryland.

Scope & Contents

The Dr. Hiltgunt Margret Zassenhaus Collection covers the life and work of Dr. Hiltgunt Margret Zassenhaus. Records for the Zassenhaus family are also in the collection, so the collection covers a century. Materials include A/V materials (VHS tapes), academic robes, artifacts, books, diplomas, ephemera, honors & awards, letters (correspondence), medals, manuscripts, newspapers, papers, photographs, programs, and scrapbooks. The collection represents Zassenhaus's life and her careers as a philologist, doctor, author, and public speaker.

While Zassenhaus is best known for her work with the Scandinavian political prisoners in WWII, there are few original documents in the collection from her time working for the German Justice Department. Items from her life in war-time Germany include her and her family's papers and records, few photographs, personal letters, and her German Prison Pass IDs. By contrast, there are more records from the immediate post-war period (1945-1948) including correspondence, and newspapers. The bulk of the collection's materials represent her medical, writing, and public speaking careers from the 1970s-1990s with extensive correspondence making up the majority of the materials.

Arrangement

The original donation of the Hiltgunt Margret Zassenhaus Collection comes from Zassenhaus's last will and testament, where she names items to be donated to the Enoch Pratt Free Library. Additional materials that were donated as part of the gift are believed to have been received from Lowell Reed Bowen, a personal friend of Zassenhaus. The materials were stored unprocessed in 12 archival boxes. Some items received minimal processing and were stored in three boxes within the Manuscript Room. In December 2024, the collection was revisited and processed for long-term storage.

H. M. Zassenhaus kept most of her records in personal scrapbooks. The documents were stored in containers such as 3-ring office binders, mailing envelopes, and spiral notebooks, and these scrapbooks make up Series IV: H. M. Zassenhaus's Scrapbooks. Within Series IV, the 19 scrapbooks are arranged alphabetically, and the subseries' titles follow Zassenhaus's original titles for each scrapbook. The materials within each scrapbook have been removed from their original containers for preservation and storage, and the original containers are retained separately with the exception of Subseries 19- Zassenhaus's Untitled Scrapbook. The original spiral bound scrapbook remains in the subseries because not all of the original items could not be separated from the container. Zassenhaus organized the contents of each scrapbook in chronological order, and her original order has been largely retained; however, some re-arrangement was done to keep related materials together. For example, all letters from Hans Zassenhaus found in Series IV Subseries 6 were pulled from chronological order and kept together in one folder. Within Series III: Correspondence, there are 3 additional scrapbooks which housed letters; however, these are not incorporated into Series IV because it is not clear if Zassenhaus organized these scrapbooks (i.e. these scrapbooks may have been mementoes presented as gifts to Zassenhaus).

The other items from Zassenhaus's gift that were not incorporated into scrapbooks have been arranged according to the format(s), subject(s), and date(s) of the materials. The series are organized alphabetically. Items not incorporated into a scrapbook appeared to have no order.
