Abstract	The Music Collection dates from the late 19th-20th c. It consists of a variety of sheet music, song books and music scores as well as music programs for performances. The collection can be located in an in-house database.

Scope and Contents note

The Music Collection (1882? – 1898?) was originally housed in the Misellaneous Collection of the Special Collections department at the Enoch Pratt Free Library. It consists of sheet music, scores, lyrics, and pamphlets and programs from music festivals. The first series features sheet music for bands and a musical play. The second series contains a song book of German music and a four part song book for male voices with a piano score. Although many of these items relate directly to Maryland, there is a musical and lyrical piano arrangement influenced by an Asian style of music. The final series consists of music programmes of which two are from a Saengerfest. It also contains programmes for music festivals and an anniversary concert for the employees of Chas. M. Stieff.

Arrangement note

The Music Collection dates from the late 19th-early 20thc., and is arranged into three series. These include: sheet music, song books and music scores as well as music programmes. Each series does not contain any inherent order of the items.
