**Abstract** This collection consists of research material collected by John Philips

Cranwell and William Bowers Crane for their book Men of Marque: a history of private armed vessels out of Baltimore during the War of 1812. The book was published in 1940 by W. W. Norton & Co. [E360.C73] Additional contents include insurance records of Baltimore Privateers from the War of 1812 as well as a list of private vessels and owners of vessels between 1812-1815. Also included is a post office packet of 102

"named" ships as well as 28 miscellaneous "named" ships.

## Biographical/Historical note

Privateersmen were not pirates. The Oxford English Dictionary defines a privateer as "an armed vessel owned and officered by private persons, and holding a commission from the government called letters of marque, authorizing the owners to use it against a hostile nation, especially in the capture of merchant shipping."

As Baltimore was an important port for shipping and commerce, many letters of marque had been given to the owners of schooners before the Embargo Act of 1812, and the blockade of the Atlantic ports by the British.

## **Scope and Contents**

The collection includes the list of vessels and their owners from 1812-1815; the First Lieutenants; the prize lists of English and American ships, and the list of 130 vessels in alphabetical order of their post office packets. A special limited edition of Messrs. Cranwell and Crane book, autographed by the authors, is in the rare book section in Special Collections.

The collection consists of two series: Introductory Materials and Post Office Packets of 102 ships.
