Biographical/Historical note

Marion Buchman was an award-winning Baltimore poet and native. Her poetry covered a wide range of topics, including nature, animals, family, childhood, spirituality, and Judaism. She was a lecturer and English teacher at various high schools, colleges, and universities, including Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore Free University, Rider College (in Trenton New Jersey), the Community College of Baltimore, American University, and Northwestern Senior High School. Buchman was an honorary member of the Maryland Council of English Teachers and a member of the Poetry Society of America. A number of her poetry was found in magazines and publications of the time.

Scope and Contents note

The Marion Buchman Collection covers a period of her poetry from 1914-2000 in Baltimore, Maryland. In comparison to the collection at the Johns Hopkins University, the Pratt collection is less diverse and concentrates on her poetry published in the Poetry Society of America as well as other magazines and periodicals. The collection is an inventory which showcases her work during her lifetime.

Arrangement note

The collection is housed in 2 boxes and contains 10 folders in each box. Each folder contains a magazine in which a poem by Buchman is featured. The magazines do not appear to have an original order and were not grouped together in any specific manner.
