Abstract	Norman Thompson Aeisler Munder was born in Baltimore, Maryland in 1867, and began his career as a printer at the age of seven. Upon his death in 1953, Munder donated a collection of broadsides, memorabilia, brochures, and examples of the fine art of printing to the Enoch Pratt Library. An internationally renowned printer and authority on typography, Munder retired from his own printing company in 1931 and became an advisory printing consultant to the Enoch Pratt Library in 1935. The materials in the collection include: personal papers, company history, printing techniques, material printed by Munder as well as fine printing copies presented to him

Biographical note

Norman Thompson Aeisler Munder was born Christmas night, 1867 at 230 W. Lombard Street in Baltimore. His father, Charles Frederick Munder, Sr., the first preserve and candy maker in Maryland, died in 1868 when Norman was four months old. At the age of seven, young Norman and his two older brothers bought a small printing press and embarked upon the printing business. Norman and his brother, Charles F. Munder, Jr. worked after school at a printer on Baltimore Street near Calvert. Charles died at the early age of 28, and Norman at 19 along with brother Wilmer Lee Munder was made a member of the new firm, Munder Bros, 55 Water Street, along with their cousin William A. Marburg. The business flourished.

After the Baltimore fire of 1904, the firm of Norman T. A. Munder was formed. In 1905, Wilmer "Billie" Munder died and his place in the company was taken by Ned Thomsen. The business continued as the Munder-Thomsen Co. until 1909 when Thomsen withdrew to form the Thomsen-Ellis Co. with Frank Ellis. By 1916, Munder's firm had 33 employees and eleven presses and occupied a floor in the Candler building. Munder's reputation as a fine printer flourished with the completion of the Strathmore Book, a book of fine paper sampling. After a series of reproductions of etchings, art collectors began commissioning Munder for high quality printing. Munder printed elaborate books for the private libraries of J. Pierpont Morgan, John D. Rockerfeller, Andrew Carnegie and the Metropolitan Museum of Art. In 1931, the depression closed the plant.

Joseph Wheeler, librarian of the Enoch Pratt Free Library asked Munder to join the library advisory staff to take charge of the modest printing plant operated by the library. While at the Pratt he designed the books and brochures that the library published. He also supervised the publication of a series of poetry broadsides that were distributed to Baltimore City Public Schools. In 1935, Munder reproduced the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution for The Library of Congress. In 1953, Munder died at the age of 85.

Scope and Contents note

Norman T.A. Munder, an internationally renowned printer and authority on typography, was born in Baltimore in 1867 and owned and operated a printing business in the city. He was later the printer at the Enoch Pratt Free Library. The material in this collection dates from 1911 after the death of Norman Munder's brother "Billie" in 1905, and subsequent to the period of the partnership with Ned Thomsen. The collection includes personal and company papers, selections of Munder's writing on printing techniques and process, as well as examples of his work.

Arrangement

I. Personal Papers, 1921-1937 This series contains a handwritten autobiography, published biographies, 1937, and awards and certificates, which are arranged chronologically.

II. Company History, 1923-1939 History of T.A. Munder and Company includes the incorporation pamphlet, stock certificates, promotional material and advertising for the company. Material is arranged by format.

III. Printing Techniques, 1912-1924 Munder was a scholar in the history of printing, printing techniques and paper. This series includes his handwritten printing history, the reproductions of etchings printed by Munder, and his system of paper selection. These are arranged by format.

IV. Printed Material, 1911-1940 This series contains items printed by Norman T. A. Munder. These are arranged by format and chronologically within format. The material includes broadsides, Christmas cards, photographs, pamphlets and books. The books are housed on shelves alongside the archival boxes.

V. Presentation copies, 1929-1940 The books, pamphlets, and monograms presented to Munder are arranged chronologically.

VI. Oversize materials, 1918-1937 These are large format items and are arranged according to series within the box.
